Hello,

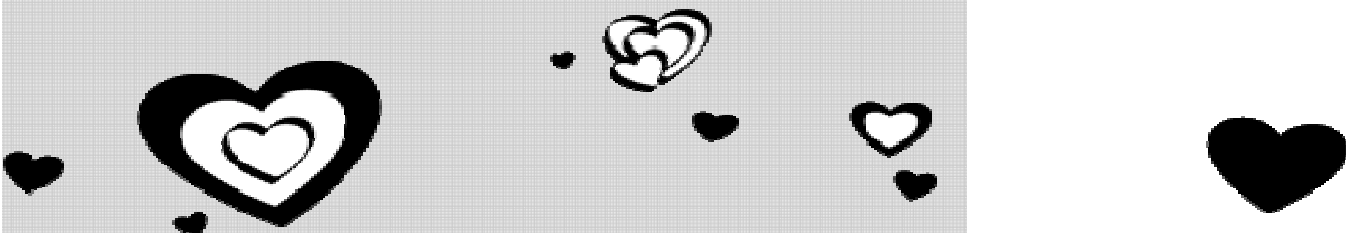
Recently I met with a parent who had some concerns about how things are done here at the high school. Unfortunately I can't explain the resolution to the parents/students...except to those that were involved in the problem. As such, students have misconceptions about discipline of other students which lead to misunderstanding which leads to gossip which can lead to more misconception and so on... I want you know that I as principal at RCHS do everything I can to be fair, exhibit grace, get input from my boss, and anything else I can do...and then I turn it over to God and ask him to guide my final decisions. That is why I am involved in RCHS...to serve God in this ministry as I work with students and parents.

Another area of concern, for some, is the planned addition of football to the sports offerings at RCHS (not yet board approved). The addition of football should not adversely affect any other sport, will not cost the school/district any money, and should drive at least 2 or more additional student enrollments each school year. In the long run, football should help us improve all our sports facilities, such as the weight room, shared use fields, etc. We should have more detailed information very soon.

I can't staff classrooms, buy textbooks, plan sports, develop new offerings, etc. until I have a good grip on the number of students God wants here at RCHS. Also, Mr. Bryant reiterated last week, "If anyone is interested in Financial Aid for 2010-2011 it will be on a first come basis this year". Contact the district office for questions.

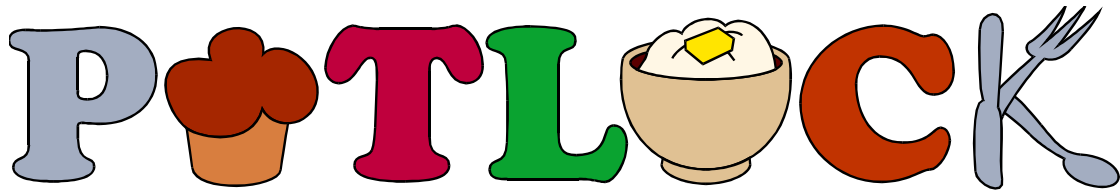
