

Share a Story Trading Card

1. After you read your story, share your story as if it were a trading card!
2. On the front of your "trading card," write the title, author and how many pages are in the book. Include the following information:

*Draw a picture of the main character in the story.

*Under the main character's picture, write a saying that they are famous for or known for or said often.

3. On the back of your "trading card," include these parts:

Personal History: Information about the main character that you learned from the book you read.

Statistics: What special things your main character did.

This card belongs to: Don't forget to write *your* name!

4. Now, fold your card in half so that the writing is on the outside. Glue it closed. Now you have a trading card for your book's main character!

Statistics:

- * Sam Patch's first jump was when he was a baby. He jumped out of his mother's arms into a washtub of soapsuds.
- * As a boy, Sam jumped off everything: barns, trees, a mill roof and bridges.
- * Sam jumped off the Passaic River Bridge in New Jersey. (77 feet high)
- * Sam jumped off Niagara Falls. (over 100 feet high)
- * Sam's last jump was off Genesee Falls in New York. (higher than Niagara Falls)
